


Performance Monitoring and Accountability (PMA2020) uses innovative mobile technology to support low-cost, rapid-turnaround surveys to monitor key indicators for family planning. The project is implemented by local universities and research organizations in 11 countries, deploying a cadre of female resident enumerators trained in mobile-assisted data collection. PMA2020/Kinshasa is led by the University of Kinshasa's School of Public Health, in collaboration with Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine. The study is funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Institute for Population and Reproductive Health at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health with support from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.


Modern Contraceptive Prevalence Rate (Women in Union, Age 15-49)




Current Modern Method Mix Among Contraceptive Users in Union (n=330)



Current Modern Method Mix Among Unmarried Sexually Active Contraceptive Users (n=212)




Life Events by Age 18 (Percent of All Women Age 18-24)



SAMPLE DESIGN

PMA2018/Kinshasa Round 7 used a two-stage cluster design to draw a sample of 58 enumeration areas (EA) representative for the city of Kinshasa, using selection probabilities proportional to EA size. Sampling and listing of households occurred prior to the start of data collection. For each EA, 33 households were randomly selected, and all women of reproductive age (ages 15-49) within each selected household were contacted and consented to be interviewed. A total of 1,854 households (98.4% response rate), and 2,583 females (95.7% response rate), were interviewed, along with 186 SDPs (93.5% response rate). Data collection was conducted between October and November 2018.
